Dear Miss Samsonoff,

On reply to your kind letter dated 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 1951  
I want first to thank you.

My little daughter Fiorella was born in Rome on July 18<sup>th</sup>, 1941. She is an Italian by birth and a Jew by religion and was deported at the age of 2 1/2, on October 16<sup>th</sup>, 1943.

The name of her father is Leone; I suppose she was deported into Germany but I have no exact information about this. At the same time I can't inform you whether she was separated by her grand mother Fiorina Spizzichino, aged 65 when she was taken off by Germans just at the same date (October 16<sup>th</sup>, 1943) my little daughter.

Fiorella should be now 10 years old. She has a large red spot and a scar on her right flank, dark eyes and curled dark hairs.

On the other hand I can inform you that Anticoli Fiorella, born in Rome on July 13, 1935 is a niece of mine.

Her father is Angelo Anticoli, my brother, and her mother Celeste Zarfati. They were all deported by Germans on May 20<sup>th</sup>, 1944, together with their family - 4 children his mother in law and his sister in law. *ITALIAN JEW* *9/6/26, 93*

✓ Anticoli Fiorella and Anticoli Luciana are too my nieces. Their father Giacomo Anticoli is my brother. They were deported together with parents on 16.10.1943.

No other of these children called Anticoli are related to me.

These are all the informations I can supply to you. Let me thank you once again for your kindness and believe me
